As you will be aware, last Saturday, several hundred of my constituents met in Huntingdon town centre to march to Hinchingsbrooke Hospital.

At the rally, there were representatives of all local political parties, unions, formal support groups for Hinchingsbrooke and unconnected, but concerned, local residents.

All of the supporters present agreed to three main principles'

1. That there should be no merger between Hinchingsbrooke Hospital and Peterborough Hospital;
2. Full services should be retained at Hinchingsbrooke Hospital;
3. There should be a full public consultation on the proposals put forward by the Boards of Hinchingsbrooke and Peterborough Hospitals at their meetings at the end of May.

There is a general understanding that savings and joint working are required and to be encouraged, but you will be hard pushed to find anyone locally who would support the notion that this should happen exclusively between Hinchingsbrooke Hospital and Peterborough Hospital.

I have a local petition supporting these aims which now has over 5000 signatures. As local people are still signing, it is my intention to let this run until closer to the Board meeting later this month, but I would like you to consider the strength of local feeling when you are deliberating the proposals ahead of the Board meeting.
